Title : Tree Census of Karad city

The Objectives of the Practice

- To make an inventory of number of tree individuals and tree species of Karad City.

The Context

- Trees are home to 50% of the world's biodiversity. They are the most vital element of urban landscape and serve as green lungs.
- Tree diversity assessment and planning are two fundamental steps in enabling urban biodiversity conservation.
- The assessment involves survey of tree individuals and species diversity exists in the city.
- Tree census is an important scientific, technical, and educational method to assess their present status.

The Practice

- Dr Salunkhe C.B., Botany department led the activity as Co-ordinator and taxonomy expert in organizing the programme.
- It is a joint venture with students from the college as volunteers, taxonomy experts from other colleges, Karad Gymkhana-A local NGO and Karad Municipal Corporation.
- In the beginning a workshop and training programme is organized for volunteers and participating organization to disseminate the concept and other details of the tree census activity.
- Teams with taxonomy expert as leader and volunteers with local peoples are made for tree survey.
- Census of trees with girth and height of 10 cm and 2 mts. respectively is made with respect to Tree Act 1975.
- Mapping of some valuable and old trees are made by using GPS.
- In the year 2011 the census has been completed without any funds from government or local agencies.

Evidence of success

- The tree census results enable to characterize tree population in terms of its structure, function, and value.
- Shri Prithviraj Chavan, Science and Technology Minister, New Delhi personally inaugurated the programme and appreciated the efforts.
- It sets an example needed for joint collaboration of academicians, students and stakeholders from the society.

Problems Encountered

- Local politicians and authorities of Karad Municipal Corporation are not cooperative throughout the activity.
