

Title : Jaywant Krida Prabodhini

The Objectives of the Practice

- Taking the need of rural area, 'Jaywant Krida Prabodhini' is established to fulfill the requirement of economically deprived students from rural area.

The Practice

- A list of nearby primary schools and high schools is made for communication.
- Faculty from physical education and arts visited the schools and other institutes to enroll students those who wish to join the academy. The consent from parents and heads of the schools is taken.
- During summer vacation the activities are organized from 16th April to 30th April. From 8.00 a.m. to 10.00 a.m. physical training is organized. From 10.30 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. there is short recess. Lectures of resource persons are organized from 11.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m.
- Video clips and power point presentations on the topics like Bio-diversity conservation, social awareness etc. are shown to create awareness on environmental crisis and motivate the students.

Evidence of success

- Students enrolled from primary schools and high schools are very much attracted towards sports and game activities.
- It creates awareness about physical and mental fitness.
- Feedback from the parents and heads of the primary schools and high schools gives significant result in support of the activity.

Problems Encountered

Title : International Year of forests

The Objectives of the Practice

- To celebrate the International Year of Forests by organizing various activities.

The Context

- The year 2011 was declared the International Year of Forests by the United Nations to raise awareness and strengthen the management, conservation and sustainable development of all types of forests for the benefit of current and future generations.
- There is need to highlight the value of forests and their economic and social relationship with humankind, role in maintaining biological diversity, protecting land and water resources and in improving air quality.

- NTFP's exhibition visited by students, teachers from high school and local peoples. It greatly helps in raising awareness about importance and conservation of forests for sustainable future.

Problems Encountered

- No major problem encountered in organizing the programme.

- Seed money to organize student's forest camps for better exposure to forest wealth.
