Title : Biodiversity Audit

The Objectives of the Practice

- Biodiversity documentation of college campus and surrounding environment through participation of students.

The Context

- Anthropological activities and environmental crisis all over the world in this century has resulted in the severe loss of biodiversity
- Present status documentation of local biodiversity is needed to create awareness and its importance in ecosystem.

The Practice

- Taxonomy experts from Botany and Zoology take initiative with other faculty and students from second and third year degree students.
- Groups of students are made and various topics related with documentation of flora and fauna like flowering trees, birds, butterflies, reptiles allotted to them.
- Extensive and intensive visits are made to selected area for documentation.
- The collected plant samples are identified in the laboratory with available literature and documented in the form of herbarium. Birds, reptiles, butterflies and other insects are documented in the form of photo plates.

Evidence of success

- About 315 species of flowering plants, 66 types of birds, 25 types of reptiles, 29 types of butterflies and 10 types of other insects are documented in the campus and its surrounding area.
- The results revealed that the campus and its surrounding area are rich in biodiversity and the college botanical garden playing a role of biodiversity repository.

Problems Encountered

- Due to enthusiastic rural students and internationally recognized faculty experts in taxonomy, problem is not encountered during the activity.

Resources Required

- For publication of the documentation efforts are being made for funding.
